The Spring District is concentrated on creating a sustainable and environmentally-friendly neighborhood in Bellevue. Parks feature repurposed materials for benches and planter boxes, and multiple buildings are applying for LEED certification. The walkability, accessibility to transportation, and open parks in The Spring District also encourage visitors, tenants, and businesses to enjoy the outdoor space and reduce their carbon footprint in any way that they can. Other sustainable strategies the neighborhood is implimenting are rain gardens to infiltrate storm water runoff, a heat recovery wheel for the HVAC system to collect building waste to use for maintaining building temperatures, and building windows strategically placed to maximize daylight into the workplace.

TIME TO CELEBRATE THE ADMINS

April 21st is Administrative Professionals Day! The holiday was created after the formation of the National Secretaries Association in 1942 to recognize the contributions of admin personnel to the economy, support their development, and attract workers to the field. The organization was formed in response to World War II when there was a shortage of people with administrative skills due to Depression-era birth-rate decline and booming post-war business.

The original celebration was heralded as "National Secretaries Week" held in June, then was moved to the last week of April in 1955 with Wednesday marked as Administrative Professionals Day.

This past week, blood usage at local hospitals increased, while Bloodworks Northwest has seen a drastic dip in donors, with over 1,000 open appointments in the next two weeks. While donors of all blood types are encouraged to donate, there is a special need for type O+ Donors. Your donation at a Bloodworks location will play a vital role in the blood supply at local hospitals.

Your one-hour donation appointment is a safe action to support local hospitals and patients. Pop-Up Donor Centers are being conducted in accordance with social distancing guidelines.


BLOOD SHORTAGE

This past week, transfusions were extremely high at 113% of normal average (two days, distributions to local hospitals were 150% of normal) in addition there has been a decrease in donors making and keeping their appointments resulting in an availability of over 1300 open appointments over the next two weeks. You can help push back against this blood shortage by scheduling an appointment here.

Ensuring life-saving blood products are on hand, when needed, is a civic responsibility we all share - please encourage friends and family to donate also. While donors of all blood types are encouraged to donate, there is a special need for type O+ donors as hospital usage of O+ blood increased.

Appointments and masks required. The one hour donation appointment is a safe and essential action. Add donation locations are being conducted in accordance with social distancing guidelines. No walk-ins, guests, or people under age 16 are permitted onsite. There is no wait to donate if you receive the Pfizer, Moderna, Johnson & Johnson/ Janssen, Novovax, or AstraZeneca COVID vaccine.
