INTERNATIONAL DECEMBER HOLIDAYS

There are many holidays celebrated in December. Winter is a time for going indoors and taking stock, planning for the coming season, and celebrating with loved ones. In the Northern Hemisphere, the winter solstice represents the longest night of the year. For centuries cultures around the world have honored the return of the sun – as the solstice marks the days getting longer. From the Chinese celebration of Dong Zhi to the Roman celebration of Saturnalia, cultures have embraced the significance of storing food and wine for the long cold winter months by coming together as a community and feasting and giving gifts.

Many ancient rituals are recognizable in modern traditions across the world, such as bringing greenery from the outdoors into the home, lighting candles, fireworks and gift giving. These family celebrations are holiday traditions that are centuries old.

Christmas, Hannukkah, Kwanzaa, Yule, Bohdi Day, and Lunar New Year are some of the many wintertime cultural celebrations and holidays celebrated today.

EASTSIDE MEN'S SHELTER

People living unsheltered is a growing problem nationwide. There are many root causes of homelessness including lack of affordable housing, low-paying jobs, domestic violence, chronic health problems, substance abuse and mental health issues.

The <u>2020 Point in Time count</u>, counted more than 1,000 people as homeless on the Eastside and the Bellevue School District reported 375 homeless youth attending school in the district during the 2020-2021 school year.

The city is investing in facilities such as shelters, transitional housing and affordable housing units for those living in vehicles or unsheltered in our community. Property on Eastgate Way in Bellevue has been purchased and approved for the construction of shelter facilities, and additional funding has been allocated to support shelter and housing services. Congregations for the Homeless, a Bellevue nonprofit that has been serving men on the Eastside experiencing homelessness for nearly three decades, will operate the shelter. Plymouth Housing, a non-profit developer and operator of supportive housing for homeless individuals, will operate the permanent supportive housing. And Inland Group, a Spokane-based developer of affordable housing will build the workforce housing. The purchase and project are also being facilitated by Horizon Housing Alliance, a non-profit developer of affordable housing.

Expect completion in 2023 and the campus will include:

- A 100-bed men's enhanced shelter and services center (Congregations for the Homeless)
- 92 permanent supportive homes for homeless individuals being referred from Eastside shelters (Plymouth Housing)
- 360 homes for low-income wage earners. This part of the campus will also include a 10,000 square foot early learning center (Inland Group)

<u>Congregations for the Homeless</u> Executive Director David Bowling said "This campus has surpassed our initial expectations by becoming a cornerstone for ensuring affordable homes and safe shelter exists within our community. All the public and private parties came together toward a common vision, setting the stage for providing coordinated, efficient and effective housing and services."

"This property sale will enable the first and only permanent men's shelter on the Eastside, and it will go further, with the first permanent supportive housing constructed on the Eastside and affordable homes for hundreds of families. This project has become more than I could have dreamed thanks to the tenacity and dedication of Congregations for the Homeless and their partners, with critical support from local government."



Popcorn Cake

This nostalgic popcorn cake is like a giant popcorn ball to feed a crowd! Prep Time 5 minutes Total Time 20 minutes

Ingredients

2 sticks unsalted butter 2 10 oz. bags mini marshmallows 1/2 t. Vanilla 2 1/2 2.69 oz. bags popcorn 1/2 C. M&Ms



Instructions

- 1. Pop popcorn and separate kernels.
- 2. Heat butter on the stove on low heat in a large high-wall pot (like a pasta pot) When melted, incorporate the marshmallows and vanilla.
- 3. Once completely mixed together, incorporate the popcorn into the marshmallow mix.
- 4. Spray an angel food cake pan with a non-stock spray (Or a smooth sided cake pan; we were looking for a wreath shape.)
- 5. Spoon in a first layer of popcorn into the pan. Sprinkle in a small handful of M&Ms.
- 6. Continue to alternate with popcorn and M&Ms until the pan is filled.
- 7. Using a greased hand, press popcorn down until tightly packed, and the total cake is about 3 inches tall.
- 8. Turn out onto a flat surface and rest.
- 9. Slice with a serrated knife.
