Emerging Radiance:

Honoring the Nikkei Farmers of Bellevue

In February of this year, honoring the 80th anniversary of the Day of Remembrance, Emerging Radiance, was exhibited to celebrate the untold stories of Japanese American strawberry farmers who lived in Bellevue from 1920 to 1942. This innovative art installation is a mural that prompts visitors to scan a series of QR codes bringing to life survivors of the internment of Japanese Americans between 1942 and 1945.

The immersive art installation was directed by Tani Ikeda and illustrated by Michelle Kumata won the Tribeca Festival 2022 Best Immersive Award. Meta Open Arts produced the exhibit and Future Arts acted as a producing partner.

With a hand-painted mural and Spark Augmented Reality Instagram filters, visitors have the opportunity to meet three survivors of the World War II incarceration camps. The exhibit showcases their connections to the land before World War II. life during incarceration, and their lives post-World War II.

The full list of winners from the 2022 Tribeca Festival is here. Emerging Radiance is part of the <u>Immersive</u> category showcasing cutting-edge virtual, augmented, and mixed reality experiences.

In honor of the 80th Anniversary of the Day of Remembrance, a video was created celebrating the Nikkei Farmers of Bellevue. highlighting the history and residents, as well as featuring the growth of the **Emerging Radiance** art installation and the artists who collaborated in its creation.

THE VALUE OF RECYCLING

Does recycling work? Are the materials you recycle actually being recycled? How clean, empty, and dry does something have to be to retain its recycling value?

These are common questions from customers across the region. Bottom line: 2022 recycling markets are thriving, accepted materials put in your recycling containers are being recycled, and residents and businesses continue to benefit the environment and economy by recycling plastic, paper, cardboard, glass, and metal.

Many people remember China's National Sword policy in 2018 that banned import of several recyclable materials to China, including mixed paper and certain plastics, due to non-recyclable material being mixed in. The media heavily covered the National Sword policy, and as a result, many people began to feel skeptical about the value of recycling. However, since then, recycling markets are thriving again! In the Pacific Northwest, some of the materials that used to be shipped overseas are now being recycled locally too!

Use these important tips to Recycle Right:

When in doubt, find out! Check Bellevue's recycling guidelines. Find helpful tips at <u>BellevueWA.gov/recycle-at-home</u>

Recycling must be empty, clean, and dry. It's okay if a few drops of water remain, recycling does not have to be dishwasher clean and dry, but it's important to empty all liquids to prevent mold. Remember to keep your recycling container lid closed to prevent rain or snow from getting everything wet.



BORDERLESS COLLABORATION IN THE SPRING DISTRICT

Students in the Masters in Technology Innovation program at GIX recently spent two days learning about emerging uses of blockchain and Web 3.0. The Web 3 workshop, led by tech entrepreneurs Chris Banbury of Vision and Ehsan Shariati of Functionland, introduced MSTI students to the basics of Web 3 and its applications. Students were given a hands-on learning opportunity to experience the collaborative development of a server network of Raspberry Pis designed to withstand the failure of individual notes without data loss. This distributed, private network uses technology to ensure data redundancy and access across the whole network. "We really learned practical tools," said Teja Balu, an MSTI student. "We were able to implement what we learned that day. Being able to look at something and then do it was really helpful."

"I loved seeing the students experiment with the blockchain and learn how to mint NFTs," said Dr. John Raiti, who leads the hardware/ software lab course. "The students were able to go from learning about Web 3 to implementing a distributed array in just two days. It was a great learning experience for them."



Cauliflower Potato Salad Recipe

(Low Carb Paleo Potato Salad)

This quick & easy cauliflower mock potato salad recipe is low carb, keto, paleo, gluten-free, whole 30, and healthy. It's a crowd pleaser for everyone. Perfect for your holiday BBQs and potlucks.

Ingredients

1 large head Cauliflower (cut into small florets)

2/3 cup Mayonnaise

1 tbsp Apple cider vinegar

1 tbsp Dijon mustard

1/2 tsp Garlic powder

1/2 tsp Paprika

1/2 tsp Sea salt


1/4 tsp Black pepper

1/3 cup Onion (finely diced)

1/3 cup Celery (finely diced)

2 large Egg (hard boiled, chopped)

Chives (for garnish - optional)



- Cook the cauliflower on the stove or in the microwave. 1) Stove method: Boil a pot of water with a tablespoon of salt. Add the cauliflower, and simmer until very tender (about 5 minutes). Drain well.
 - Microwave method: Place the cauliflower florets in a large bowl with 2 tablespoons (30 mL) of water. Microwave on high for 10 minutes, stirring halfway through. Drain well.
- 2) Meanwhile, whisk together the mayonnaise, apple cider vinegar, Dijon mustard, garlic powder, paprika, sea salt, and black pepper, until smooth.
- 3) Stir the cauliflower, onion, celery, and egg together with the dressing. If desired, garnish with chives and additional paprika.
- 4) Serving size is one cup. Recipe from The Easy Keto Cookbook.
