The November 2022 general election takes place on Tuesday, November 8. NOVEMBER IS NATIVE AMERICAN **HERITAGE MONTH**

In 2016, the Metropolitan King County Council proclaimed November Native American Heritage Month in the state of Washington. This declaration mirrors national recognition of Native American peoples nationwide.

King County is home to the Muckleshoot, Snoqualmie, and Duwamish Tribes. In fact, Seattle is named for Duwamish Tribal Leader, Chief Sealth. The official declaration brings honor and recognition to the cultural contributions of Native Americans throughout our local history. Native Americans of the Pacific Northwest continue to fight to maintain their culture, language, dance, food, and values.

Cranberry & Brie Crescent Ring

Be the life of the potluck with this cheery and delicious appetizer. It's quick and easy, but makes a big impression.

Ingredients

- 2 tubes crescent dough
- 1 cup cranberry sauce
- 1 wheel brie cheese, cut into 12 wedges
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1 teaspoon flaky sea salt
- 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaf



Preparation

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375°F (190°C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Arrange the crescent roll triangles on the prepared baking sheet with the points sticking out, overlapping the bases to form an 8-inch (20 cm) circle.
- 3. Spoon the cranberry sauce onto the bases of the crescent dough triangles and top with the brie wedges. Fold the pointed ends of the dough over the cranberry sauce and brie and tuck underneath to seal.
- 4. Brush the ring with the beaten egg and sprinkle with the flaky salt and thyme.
- 5. Bake for 30 minutes, rotate halfway through, or until dark golden brown. Transfer to a platter and serve.
- 6. Enjoy!

AMERICA RECYCLES DAY

America Recycles Day educates individuals on how to be more mindful of what they consume, where and how to properly recycle, and encourages them to make a pledge to properly recycle more often in their everyday lives. America Recycles Day was first celebrated on November 15, 1997, by 40 participating states, and by 2007 all 50 states participated and over 3,000 events were organized nationwide.

Here are a few tips to help you be more mindful:

- Any item covered in food is not recyclable, so be sure to rinse off containers before throwing them into the recycle bin.
- Plastics marked #1 #7 are recyclable check the bottom of the item!
- Styrofoam and plastic wrap are not recyclable, instead opt for aluminum food packaging (or reusable containers) to preserve your leftovers.

 Tissues and paper towels are not recyclable - BUT they are compostable!
