

BELLHOP - FREE RIDE AROUND BELLEVUE

Exploring the City of Bellevue just got a whole lot easier! Starting this month, explore Bellevue for free by using <u>BellHop</u>. BellHop is an all electric fleet of vehicles that will pick you up for free and shuttle you around the Bellevue corridor, an area of approximately 6 square miles. The route includes The Bellevue Botanical Garden, KidsQuest Museum and The Spring District! All you have to do is download the Circuit app! Visit the website and learn more, <u>BellHop</u>.





POWERED BY CIRCUIT

According to Visit Bellevue, Bellhop aims to replace short car rides of two miles or less - which accounts for 35% of car trips - with more sustainable options. Bellhop is projected to reduce over 100 metric tons of CO2 emissions annually. "This point-to-point, on-demand, all-electric connector transportation service signifies a meaningful stride towards our commitment to sustainability, and we are eager to see how it revolutionizes last-mile travel while enhancing the visitor experience in Bellevue," said Brad Jones, Executive Director of Visit Bellevue. This unique pilot program will run through December 31 and plans to integrate eco-friendliness with an elevated, sustainable, and a seamless travel experience.

PAPER SHREDDING RECYCLING EVENT AUGUST 19TH AT SAMMAMISH HIGH SCHOOL

Bring your documents containing sensitive information to a paper shredding event at <u>Sammamish High School (100 140th Ave. SE)</u>, on <u>Saturday, Aug. 19, 9:00am-12:00pm</u> or until the trucks are full. With an onsite shredder, a secure company will shred and recycle documents. Empty boxes will be immediately returned to customers. We cannot recycle any boxes on site.

Bellevue residents only & limit of 4 banker-size boxes per car (11"x11"x17.5" max per box), no exceptions.

The following material is NOT accepted at this event: already shredded paper, computer disks, plastic of any kind, X-rays, three-ring binders, cardboard, and garbage.

Remember that when you shred paper at home the shredded paper cannot go in your home recycling or composting carts! If you shred your sensitive paper documents at home, then the shredded paper belongs in the garbage. Since shredded paper is harder to recycle than whole sheets, please shred only what you need to. The state Attorney General's Office offers additional guidance on shredding: <u>ATG.WA.gov/what-shred</u>. 

Currently under development with several sections open, Eastrail is truly a generational opportunity built for everyone as a wide, flat trail, with amazing scenery and lots of ways to connect with neighbors and our region through transit and public spaces!

<u>Eastrail Partners</u>, the 501c3 nonprofit that unifies and galvanizes this ambitious trail effort, works to create a thriving trail that reflects the diversity of the Puget Sound in partnership with communities, business, and governments to raise awareness, secure trail funding, and connect people to each other and the trail.

We believe Eastrail must be safe and accessible, especially for individuals and communities who might not traditionally feel comfortable in this space: we are committed to an inclusive Eastrail that is welcoming to all.

In our first three years as an organization, <u>Eastrail Partners</u> helped secure \$43M for the Eastrail effort, and built community through partnerships and trail activation.

Frozen Yogurt Bark By Brittany Mullins, Eating Bird Food

This fast & easy warm-weather treat is perfect for a summer evening dessert. It can easily be modified to accommodate dietary restrictions! Make this recipe and tag <u>@TheSpringDistrict</u>! We want to hear from you!

INGREDIENTS

Ingredients

1 1/2 cups plain full-fat Greek yogurt
2 Tablespoons maple syrup or honey
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/3-1/2 cup fresh strawberries sliced
1/3-1/2 cup fresh blueberries
2-3 Tablespoons unsweetened coconut flakes

DIRECTIONS

1. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper.

2. In a medium bowl, stir together yogurt, maple syrup and vanilla until well combined.

3. Spread yogurt mixture evenly, about a 1/4 of an inch thick, onto the prepared baking sheet in rectangular shape. Scatter the strawberries and blueberries on top. Sprinkle with coconut flakes.

4. Place in the freezer for about 3 hours or until the yogurt is firm. Cut or break into 16-20 pieces and serve.

5. Store leftover yogurt bark in a sealed freezer bag for up to 3 months. I like taking it out and letting it sit for about 3-5 minutes before eating.
