### CANADA DAY JULY 1

American Independence Day celebrates the day the Continental Congress declared independence from Great Britain. The Revolutionary War broke out in the spring of 1775, and as support for independence grew, Congress created a committee to create a formal statement justifying independence from Great

Britain. The 5-man committee was comprised of Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, Roger Sherman, Benjamin Franklin, and Robert Livingston. The Continental Congress voted unanimously in favor of independence on July 2, and formally adopted the Declaration of Independence on July 4, the official Independence Day as we know and celebrate today. #### BASTILLE DAY JULY 14

Bastille Day in France is widely recognized as Le 14 Juillet. This National Holiday Honors the storming of Bastille, a prison in Paris, on July 14, 1789. This act

of defiance is considered the beginning of the French Revolution, which eventually lead to an end to monarch rule of France. The three guiding ideals of French government are Liberty, Equality and Fraternity. The holiday is celebrated with parades featuring French military, family picnics, and fireworks.

### Whole Wheat Double Chocolate Brownie Bites

If you have a 4th of July BBQ to attend take these delicious tidbits for dessert and be the hit of the party. In addition to being the perfect size, they are festive!

### INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup all purpose flour 1/2 cup whole wheat flour 1/2 cup cocoa powder1/2 cup granulated sugar1/2 teaspoon kosher salt 1/4 cup butter, melted 1/2 cup applesauce 3 large eggs 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1/2 cup mini chocolate chips

### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

- In a large bowl, whisk together the flours, cocoa powder, sugar and salt making sure to break up any cocoa powder lumps.
  In a separate bowl, whisk together the butter, applesauce, eggs and vanilla.
  Stir the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients until combined, and fold in the mini chocolate chips.
- 5. Pour 2 tbsp of batter into each greased mini-muffin cup and bake for 10-12 minutes, or until a wooden pick inserted in the center comes out clean.

(To freeze place the baked brownie bites in labeled zipper bags and freeze for up to 3 months. Defrost at room temperature and serve.)
