

OCTOBER HOLIDAYS

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY, OCTOBER 14, 2024

As a way to celebrate the rich cultural contributions of the original inhabitants of North America, there is a movement to replace Columbus Day with Indigenous Peoples Day. The growing support for Indigenous Peoples Day being recognized as a holiday is illustrated by the fact that,



in 2023, 29 states did not celebrate Columbus Day and have either replaced or renamed the day of observation.

It is not an official federal holiday, but in 2021 President Biden became the first president to issue a proclamation recognizing Indigenous Peoples Day. The movement for change honors the people who inhabited the land when the Europeans arrived and encourages a realistic portrayal of historic events. Learn more HERE.



DIWALI BEGINS OCTOBER 31, 2024

Diwali is one of the most prominent and major Hindu festivals. Diwali, or Deepawali, is a spiritual celebration of light triumphing over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance. Worshipers light candles and lamps in their homes, temples, and

workplaces. Celebrations often include fireworks, family feasts, and the exchanging of gifts among loved ones.

Lakshmi, the Hindu goddess of prosperity and good fortune, is worshiped with great devotion for Diwali. It is believed that on this day, Lakshmi makes her earthly appearance and bestows health, wealth, and success upon her devotees. Hindus celebrate this as one of their major festivals. 
ROSH HASHANAH, OCTOBER 2 - 4, 2024

Rosh Hashanah is known as the Jewish New Year (sometimes called the birthday of the universe). This annual high holiday is celebrated with candle lighting, festive meals, prayer services, and the sounding of the shofar (ram's horn). Interspersed throughout the prayer service, the shofar is sounded as a way of heralding God as the King



of the World. This day is reserved as a time to ask the Almighty to grant us a year of peace, prosperity, and blessing. Holiday feasts include challah bread, and apples dipped in honey--symbolizing wishes for a sweet year ahead.

YOM KIPPUR OCTOBER 11-12, 2024

Yom Kippur is the holiest day of the year for the Jewish faith. Translated to mean "Day of Atonement", Yom Kippur is a day set aside to "afflict the soul" as a way to atone for the sins of the past vear.

This holy day is observed by prayer and fasting. The day before Yom Kippur, families and loved ones come together for a feast in preparation for the 25 hours of fasting. After a day of prayer services, with one long blast of the shofar (ram's horn), Yom Kippur and fasting is over and worshipers gather in celebration enjoying comfort food, such as blintzes, noodle pudding and baked goods. SPOTLIGHT ON THE SPRING DISTRICT

GRAPES GROWING IN THE SPRING DISTRICT

Over near the swings, past the granite-top tables, you will see a row of tall, narrow raised planters forming a divider that shields the line of sight to the driveway into the parking garage. In these tall planters are wild grapes growing up wire trellis. The Latin name of these plants is Vitis californica, with the common name of the California wild grape. It is a wild grape species widespread across much of California as well as southwestern Oregon. Bunches of small and often sour but delicious purple grapes grow in autumn. The grapes provide an important food source for a variety of wild animals, especially birds, and the foliage provides a thick, often colorful, foliage.

Vitis californica is cultivated and enjoyed as an ornamental plant. The interesting shape and color of the leaves and the lush, trainable vines make this species an attractive garden plant. This vine is commonly used in native plant gardens due to it being drought tolerant once established. The plant thrives without much water during the summertime.

This year the grapes have been plentiful and very delicious. We encourage you to stop by and enjoy a taste!

ABOUT HALLOWEEN october 31, 2024

2,000 years ago the United Kingdom, and northern France celebrated the new year on November 1st. The transition time between summer and autumn was often associated with human death. The specific transition day between October 31 and November 1 was believed to be the day when souls of the dead returned to earth to cause trouble. In ceremonies featuring



animal sacrifices and burning bonfires, Celts dressed in animal heads and skins while making predictions about the coming year's crops and praying for protection during the long winter. The BEST Pumpkin Bars Recipe (With Cream Cheese Frosting)

Kick off autumn with this moist, perfectly spiced cake! The frosting makes it perfect for either a celebration or an everyday snack!

INGREDIENTS

For the Bars

2 cups All-purpose flour

1 tsp Baking powder

1 tsp Baking soda

1 tsp Pumpkin Pie Spice

1½ tsp Cinnamon

3 large Eggs

2/3 cup Vegetable oil

1 cup Brown sugar

1/4 cup Granulated sugar

15 oz Pumpkin puree

1/4 cup Whole milk

2 tsp Vanilla extract

1/2 cup Unsalted butter

For the Cream Cheese Frosting

1/2 cup Unsalted butter at room temperature

8 oz Cream cheese at room temperature

3 cups Confectioners sugar

1 tsp Vanilla extract

Sprinkles optional



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350°F/175°C. Grease a 10 x 15 inch baking pan, or line it with parchment paper. You'll need enough paper over the edges so you can easily remove the bars from the pan after cooking.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk 2 cups all-purpose flour, 1 tsp baking powder, 1 tsp baking soda, 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice, 1½ tsp cinnamon.
- 3. In a separate bowl, whisk 3 large eggs, 2/3 cup vegetable oil, 1 cup brown sugar, ¼ cup granulated sugar, 15oz can pumpkin puree, ¼ cup whole milk, 2 tsp vanilla extract until fully combined and smooth. Then, pour the mixture into the dry ingredients. Using either a mixer or a whisk mix until combined. The batter will be thick.
- 4. Pour the batter into your prepared baking pan and spread it into an even layer. Bake until the center springs back when it's gently pressed, approximately 25 - 30 minutes. Remove from the oven and place your pan on a wire rack to cool completely.
- 5. In a large mixing bowl, beat unsalted butter and cream cheese until smooth. Then add confectioner's sugar and vanilla extract. Using an electric mixer, mix until creamy and smooth. Tip: Place the cheese frosting in the fridge for 30 minutes so it 'sets' a little and is easier to use and cut; however, you don't have to do this.
- 6. When the cake has cooled completely, carefully remove it from the pan, spread the cream cheese frosting evenly over the top, and dust lightly with cinnamon and any preferred sprinkles. Cut into even bars, serve, and enjoy!
