Diwali is known worldwide as the Festival of Lights. The festival lasts four days long and symbolizes the victory of light over darkness.

Homes honor the tradition of Diwali by lighting oil filled lamps called <u>Diyas</u>. These lights are placed in rows along homes and temples. Rangolis, elaborate designs made of colored rice, sand, or flower petals, decorate the floors of homes. Families leave the windows open during the festival inviting in Lakshmi, hoping she will enter the home and bestow wealth and success on the family.

BELRED CODE UPDATES: LOOKING FORWARD TO THE FUTURE

Fifteen years ago, the City of Bellevue adopted the first BelRed subarea plan and land use code, envisioning a former industrial area transformed into a lively, walkable neighborhood with residential living, shopping and access to transit. That vision has guided new housing, parks and businesses and continues to shape how BelRed grows today.

In 2024, the city updated the BelRed Subarea Plan to reflect current growth trends and community needs. The new "BelRed Look Forward" plan builds on what's already working and strengthens policies that support a vibrant, mixed-use neighborhood with updated housing and job targets. A key feature of this update is the BelRed Arts District, designed to celebrate and sustain the creative economy.

The next step in fulfilling the vision for the future of BelRed is updating the land use code. The BelRed Look Forward Land Use Code Amendment (LUCA) will put policies into action. This code amendment will guide future development while honoring the neighborhood's unique personality and balancing priorities like housing, jobs, transportation, environment, urban design and the arts.

Community input matters in this project. The city wants to know what is most important to the people who live, work and visit BelRed.

Lately Georgia's favorite Pacific Northwest place to visit is Pt. Townsend, but she also loves Hurricane Ridge and a beach walk.





Pumpkin Baked Oatmeal

by All the Healthy Things

Fall is on its way so it's time to cozy up and enjoy some soul-soothing comfort food. The recipe is easily changed to work with the ingredients you have on hand, such as cow's milk and butter.

INGREDIENTS

2 eggs

1 3/4 cups Planet Oat Unsweetened Vanilla Oatmilk

3/4 cup pumpkin puree

1/2 cup maple syrup

1/4 cup cashew butter

2 tablespoons melted coconut oil

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 1/2 cups gluten free rolled oats

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup mini chocolate chips (plus 1 tablespoon for the top)

INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. To a large mixing bowl, add the eggs, Plant Oat Oatmilk, pumpkin puree, maple syrup, cashew butter, melted coconut oil, and vanilla extract. Whisk all of the wet ingredients together until well combined.
- 3. Next, add the gluten free oats, baking powder, pumpkin pie spice, and salt to the mixing bowl and stir until well combined.
- Next, fold the chocolate chips into the batter until well combined. 4.
- 5. Transfer the oatmeal batter to a greased 9×13 baking dish. Top with extra chocolate chips, if you like.
- 6. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes until the oatmeal is just almost set.
